A reading from Deuteronomy 26:1-11

When you have come into the land that the LORD your God is giving you as an inheritance to possess, and you possess it, and settle in it, ² you shall take some of the first of all the fruit of the ground, which you harvest from the land that the LORD your God is giving you, and you shall put it in a basket and go to the place that the LORD your God will choose as a dwelling for his name. ³ You shall go to the priest who is in office at that time, and say to him, "Today I declare to the LORD your God that I have come into the land that the LORD swore to our ancestors to give us." ⁴ When the priest takes the basket from your hand and sets it down before the altar of the LORD your God, ⁵ you shall make this response before the LORD your God: "A wandering Aramean was my ancestor; he went down into Egypt and lived there as an alien, few in number, and there he became a great nation, mighty and populous. ⁶ When the Egyptians treated us harshly and afflicted us, by imposing hard labor on us, ⁷ we cried to the LORD, the God of our ancestors; the LORD heard our voice and saw our affliction, our toil, and our oppression. ⁸ The LORD brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, with a terrifying display of power, and with signs and wonders; ⁹ and he brought us into this place and gave us this land, a land flowing with milk and honey. ¹⁰ So now I bring the first of the fruit of the ground that you, O LORD, have given me." 

RITE OF CONFIRMATION
of
Autumn Smith



***CONFIRMATION** marks the completion of the congregation's program of confirmation ministry, a period of instruction in the Christian faith as confessed in the teachings of the Lutheran Church. Growth in discipleship, however, continues throughout our lives. Those who have completed this program were made members of the Church in Baptism. Confirmation includes a public profession of the faith into which the candidates were baptized, thus underscoring God's action in their Baptism.

Introduction of the Class:

L - Autumn Smith has been instructed in the Christian faith and desires to make public affirmation of her Baptism.

Bless you, Autumn, and may God’s Spirit keep you strong in the faith we profess.

P - Dear friends, we give thanks for the gift of baptism and for Autumn, one with us in the body of Christ, who is making public affirmation of her baptism.

C - Thanks be to God!

P - Let us pray. Merciful God, we thank you for Autumn, whom you have made your own by water and the Word in baptism. You have called her to yourself, enlightened her with the gifts of your Spirit, and nourished her in the community of faith. Uphold all your servants in the gifts and promises of baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the name of Christ.

C - Amen.

P - I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, reject sin, and confess the faith of the Church.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

R - I renounce them.

P - Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God?

R - I renounce them.

P - Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

R - I renounce them.

P - Do you believe in God the Father?

R & C - I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

P - Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

R & C - I believe in Jesus Christ, God’s only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

P - Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

R & C - I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

P - You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy baptism:
to live among God's faithful people,
to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper,
to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
to serve all people, following the example of Jesus,
and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

R - I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.

P - People of God, do you promise to continue to support Autumn and to pray for her in her life in Christ?

C - We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

P - Let us pray.

We give you thanks, O God, that through water and the Holy Spirit you give us new birth, cleanse us from sin, and raise us to eternal life.

(The Pastor lays hands on the head of the confirmand. Parents are also invited to join in this act of blessing)

P - Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in Autumn the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm her faith, guide her life, empower her in her serving, give her patience in suffering, and bring her to everlasting life.

R - Amen.
